

WHY?

Although most Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Queer and Intersex (LGBTIQ+) Australians live healthy and happy lives, research has demonstrated that a disproportionate number experience poorer mental health outcomes and have higher risk of suicidal behaviours than their peers. These health outcomes are directly related to experiences of stigma, prejudice, discrimination and abuse on the basis of being LGBTIQ+.

The purpose of this resource is to provide information and increase awareness of the services, programs, and supports available to LGBTIQ+ young people (12-25) in Melbourne's inner Metro area, with a particular focus on the inner East (Port Philip, Stonnington, Boroondara).

It also includes ways for LGBTIQ+ young people to connect via support groups, days of celebration, and media.

The resource can be used by young people, their families, and carers, as well as the organisations and services that work to support LGBTIQ+ young people. Throughout the online version of this resource, there are clickable web links providing further information.

LGBTIQ+ FRIENDLY CLINICS & HEALTH CENTRES

To combat the health risks that LGBTIQ+ young people may face, the following health centres and clinics offer a variety of services.

Although not all are youth specific, they all offer a range of services and therapies to young people, each with trained professionals employed.

THE ROYAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL MELBOURNE GENDER SERVICE

The Royal Children's Hospital (the RCH) Melbourne Gender Service aims to improve the physical and mental health outcomes of children and adolescents who are trans or gender diverse.

SERVICES

Families who access The RCH Gender Service with their child or adolescent will be provided with a family centred approach to care. This will entail a multidisciplinary assessment of their child or adolescent regarding gender diversity or gender dysphoria. As an outcome of the assessment, support and treatment pathways will be offered.

The RCH Gender Service accept new referrals from across Victoria for any child or adolescent up to the age of 17 years with concerns regarding their gender identity. A referral from a General Practitioner (GP) to the Gender Service is required.







PRAHRAN MARKET

Prahran Market Clinic is a privately owned medical General Practice, supported by Allied Health providers. Particular focus is placed on sexual health, and Gay, Lesbian and Gender Diverse health.

The Clinic is well regarded and respected for its involvement in HIV clinical research trials and for the teaching of medical students.

THORNE HARBOUR HEALTH



Previously the Victorian Aids Council, Thorne Harbour Health is a community-controlled organisation, working for sex, sexuality and gender diverse communities. As a central part of the Victorian community response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic, Thorne Harbour provides a range of services which include prevention education, treatment and care of PLHIV and counselling services.

Their evolution has come to include a broadening of services for the health needs of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and intersex (LGBTI) communities to ensure all gender, sex, and sexually diverse individuals are treated with dignity and can participate in society.

It has an informal, friendly and relaxed atmosphere.

The registered General Practitioners are able to provide healthcare and specialist referrals for all health related matters.

Equinox is a peer led Trans and Gender Diverse (TGD) Health Service operated by Thorne Harbour Health (THH). Equinox work in partnership with the THH Trans Advisory Group and patients to establish service needs and define priorities.

By working in partnership with the TGD community, Equinox aims to provide a safe environment for gender diverse clients to obtain quality medical care. They honour and support informed decisions and will use preferred name and pronouns, whilst treating clients with respect.

PRONTO is Melbourne's only free rapid HIV testing service, for men who have sex with men. Confidential, accurate, rapid HIV testing with results in 15 minutes.

PRONTO offers rapid HIV test for free. Pathology fees are payable to the pathology lab on the day for non-Medicare card holders. PrEP consultations are bulk billed for Medicare card holders. Private fees are payable on the day for non-Medicare card holders.


Linda has been a psychologist in private practice and a member of the Australian Psychological Society for more than 20 years.

Its focus is to provide patients with the support and expertise from a comprehensive multi-disciplinary team of Psychiatrists, Addiction Medicine Specialists, Mental Health Nurses, Psychologists, Social Workers, Dietitians, and other Allied Health staff.



MONASHEHEALTH GENDER CLINIC



The Monash Health Gender Clinic (MHGC) is a state-wide service that provides individualised, consumer centred care for trans, gender diverse and non-binary people, their families and partners. Their principle aim is to improve the health outcomes and wellbeing of all clients. The MHGC accept all referrals for individuals who are aged 17 and above and reside in the state of Victoria.

They also provide support and information for health care providers as well as community and advocacy groups. The MHGC welcomes sistergirls and brotherboys from indigenous communities. Clients need to complete a General Information Form, and get a referral from a medical practitioner, such as a GP or medical specialist.

- Assess experiences of gender dysphoria in accordance with international quidelines
- Explore various medical and social interventions relevant to transgender health
- Identify other mental or physical health issues that need to be managed prior to medical interventions
- Refer, where appropriate, to experienced private or public clinicians
- Provide additional social work support or connecting with relevant social services when required
- Support the gender transition process
- Advocate for access to health services

LGBTIQ+SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

There are a number of services and programs which provide a range of supports, information, workshops, legal advice, safe spaces, and events for LGBTIQ+ young people in or close to the Inner Eastern region of Melbourne.

THE DRUM 35

The drum delivers youth services in Carlton, Kensington, North Melbourne, the Melbourne CBD, as well as the Richmond and Collingwood public housing estates. The drum is situated within drummond street services (ds), a community and family mental health and wellbeing service provider. Their work seeks to be; inclusive, supportive and to provide safe and affirmative spaces for young people to connect, as well as providing individual support and advocacy. The drum offer the following programs to LGBTIQ+ young people.

Queerspace Youth

Regular activities, events and support groups for LGBTQIA+ (and questioning) young people to increase social connection and capacity.

Regular activities and events for QTPOC (Queer / Trans, person of colour) identified young people. Invisible aims to provide autonomous spaces for QTPOC young people.



LGBTIQ+ ONLINE & PHONE SUPPORT

As immediate face to face support is not always available, phone and online supports offer LGBTIQ+ youth more immediate ways to deal with the questions and challenges they may face. Stats suggest that more than 60% of LGBTIQ+ youth use the Internet to connect with each other, often finding support and friendship online.

However, the benefits of online interactions are not without their limits, with harassment and discrimination also taking place. Many of the organisations and services previously mentioned will have online information available, however each of the following focuses on providing trusted, safe, youth friendly digital and phone services for LGBTIQ+ youth to turn to. Lifeline provide 24/7 crisis support and suicide prevention services in every state and territory via a telephone crisis helpline Lifeline also offers a nightly one-on-one online Crisis Support Chat service, which supports people who may feel more comfortable contacting them online, rather than over the phone.
