What is a FLP?

Flexible Learning Providers (FLPs) offer pathways to successful educational opportunities specifically for young people experiencing barriers to school completion.

PURPOSE

This resource outlines the flexible learning providers and their programs and courses which support young people who could benefit from alternatives to mainstream schooling.

> The providers included are located within or adjacent to Port Philip, Stonnington, and Boroondara, each offering differing learning environments and experiences.

AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF HIGHER EDUCATION

The Australian College of Higher Education assists students with special learning needs, young people who are disengaged or are at risk of becoming disengaged from mainstream school, and students with diagnosed and un-diagnosed learning disabilities and/or a mental health illness. The college uses an outreach model with flexible start times.

ACHE provide 3 key education programs which focus on the development of core skills in the areas of learning, reading, writing, oral communication and numeracy. The employment training components include developing employability skills in communication, teamwork, problem solving, initiative and enterprise, planning and organising, self-management, learning and technology. AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF HIGHER EDUCATION - PROGRAMS & COURSES

2C4S Program

Age: 15 +

Attendance: Flexible delivery model. Weekly sessions.

Outreach delivery

Through outreach delivery, the 2C4S program works with disengaged young people, early school leavers, school refusers, young mothers, adults with low levels of literacy and numeracy or adults with a disability

Working with a coach to provide one on one support individually, and/or in small group sessions, the program provides pathways into employment or further studies and includes development of individual goals and structured activities to improve reading, writing, oral communication and numeracy skills.

Students work on a nationally recognised Certificate in General Education (26 weeks) across one of 3 levels - Certificate I (intro), Certificate I and Certificate II in General Education for Adults.

Learners individually discuss their end of course options with their coach, assessing possible options including further general education courses, specific courses related to an interest area or a job goal, or employment.

Lets Go Re-engagement Program

VCAL Foundation VCAL Intermediate

Attendance: Flexible delivery model. Outreach or small group delivery throughout Melbourne

Age: 16-19 years

The Let's Go re-engagement program assists students with personal barriers which have led to severe disengagement in schooling re-engage back into education in an alternative setting. Let's Go can assist students in developing their social and emotional capabilities, leading to regained confidence and a willingness to:

- Return to formal schooling
- Continue with further accredited training options
- Seek and gain employment

Let's Go students complete their VCAL coursework including Literacy Skills, Numeracy Skills, Industry Specific and Work Related skills and other General Studies. Throughout the program students have access to teachers, trainers and assessors and a welfare officer. Rolling enrolments throughout the year enable a student to start their VCAL at any time. The Let's Go program is free to all students. An expression of interest form is the first step to enrolling in the program.

HESTER HORNBROOK ACADEMY MELBOURNE CITY MISSION (PRAHRAN)

VCAL Foundation Age: 16 -19 years Attendance: Mon to Fri 9.15am – 3.00pm Chadstone Campus	 The VCAL Foundation course is for young people who require support with their learning and/or social skills. The course focuses on the principles of applied learning, such as building on a student's interests, abilities and strengths; catering for different learning styles; promoting competence, resilience and active citizenship; experiential learning based on real life situations; and assessment methods that suit the learner and context of learning. Students study in small groups with opportunities for literacy and/or numeracy support. Students choose from a wide range of industry specific and creative/personal development electives. Four weeks of structured workplace learning further develop employability skills. Students also attend a three day camp to foster resilience and independence. Certificate I in Work Education Age: 16 -19 years Attendance: Mon to Fri 9.15am – 3.00pm Chadstone Campus	 This course is for young people who require support with their learning and/or social skills. It provides students with the skills to obtain and maintain employment. Through project based learning and straightforward teaching methods, students gain vocational and job seeking skills, and develop their personal management, teamwork and communication skills. As well as Certificate I in Work Education, students have the opportunity to study a Certificate I in Hospitality, a Certificate I in Horticulture or a Certificate I in Retail Services. Core subjects such as workplace literacy, workplace numeracy, work related skills and personal management are also studied. Certificate II in Work Education Age: 18-26 years	The Certificate II in Work Education is designed as a transition to open-employment program for individuals requiring extra support. The program focuses on customising a job role to capitalise upon the strengths and interests of each individual. Kinaesthetic, visual and applied teaching techniques are utilised to cater to differing learning preferences and needs. This course is delivered 3 days per week on campus and 2 days per week in the workplace. Students of the program have a 'discovery profile' developed for use in their future employment and take part in intensive on-the-job learning.
Attendance: Mon, Tue & Fri 9.15am – 3.00pm. Wed & Thur: Customised Work Placement	Days spent on campus facilitate responsive learning design and concentrate on how to: communicate and interact in the workplace, demonstrate professionalism, and authentically participate in meaningful employment. A maximum of 12 students per class enables learning programs to be tailored. Students are fully supported with on-the-job coaching.



The JCS model of education is hands on, academically rigorous, and tailored for each individual student. Class numbers are kept deliberately low. The school operates out of its Melbourne campus in Hawthorn, and Lavers Hill campus in the Otway ranges, as a large component of the curriculum focuses on the outdoors.

The school offers the standard 7-12 school curriculum, on top of 'real life learning' experiences that are designed to prepare students for the real world. JCS operates in conjunction with the Distance Education Centre of Victoria (DECV), a P-12 Government school. Click here for more info

Alternative Education Support

Age: 11 - 20

Attendance: Monday to Friday Flexible delivery model While the main focus at the school is social / emotional support, JCS is committed to providing academic support in line with an Individual Learning Plan which is established for each student on commencement.

The core academic curricular subjects are run in conjunction with the Distance Education Centre Victoria (DECV), or in some cases with the student's school of origin (SOO). Students are able to choose from a large selection of mainstream subjects as well as doing their own JCS in house compulsory subjects such as Work 101, Personal Development, Outdoor Education and Game Show.

The academic program is based on the National Curriculum. There are structured class times which equate to approximately four contact hours of academic studies per day. Core subjects, which all students study, include; English, Mathematics, Personal Development and Outdoor Education, with a range of electives available.

Alfonso Scibilia (Principal) (03) 9826 0330 info@kamaruka.vic.e<u>du.au</u> Kamaruka is an independent school offering an innovative curriculum that aims to meet the individual needs of boys aged 8 to 16 who are experiencing social, emotional and/or behavioural difficulties. A number of boys with low self-esteem, originating from negative experiences at school, have also benefited greatly from the program.

Due to learning difficulties associated with diagnosed disorders such as Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Oppositional Defiant Disorder (ODD) and Asperger's Syndrome, self-esteem can be eroded away over several years of failure in mainstream school settings. With a staff to student ratio of 1 to 5, Kamaruka aims to create behavioural change through positive experiences and a sense of belonging. Click here for more info



KAMARUKA EDUCATION CENTRE - PROGRAMS & COURSES

Curriculum

Age: 8 to 16 years old

Attendance: Mon to Fri 9.00am – 3.15pm

South Yarra

Kamaruka's academic curriculum focuses on literacy and numeracy. Written language, reading comprehension and mathematics make up the foundation of all other subjects. Excellence in these subjects enhances self-image and is vital to successful inclusion. An integrated curriculum caters for slower learning rates, inattentiveness and distractibility of adolescents with ADHD.

Students are challenged according to their ability level rather than age or year of schooling. To restore the often damaged and very low self-concept exhibited by these children, the curriculum at Kamaruka is deliberately weighted towards physical achievement.

Attendance at four camps provides boys another opportunity to develop skills such as camping, hiking, bush survival, cooking, surfing, and snorkelling, and to offer the opportunity for social interaction, community sharing and the development of interpersonal skills.

Career counselling is structured into the program for boys at Year 10 who are ready for transition to further education, or the work force.




SWINBURNE SENIOR SECONDARY COLLEGE
