BETTER FUTURES

Better Futures aims to engage earlier with young people leaving care, supporting them to have an active voice in their transition planning and providing individualised supports across a range of life areas including housing, education, employment, and community and cultural connections. Better Futures is a new support model designed to better prepare young people in their transition from Out of Home Care to independence.

The model promotes early leaving care planning and preparation by engaging with young people from 16 years and providing a flexible and tailored service response;

- to ensure a smooth transition from care to independent living; and
- the opportunity for young people receive support up until 21 years of age to strengthen their independent living skills and empower them to achieve their full potential.

Better Futures will provide a flexible and tailored service responses underpinned by the Advantage Thinking Practice Framework. Service responses will incorporate different levels of support that scale up and down, based on a young person's support needs.

Eligibility Criteria:

Better Futures assists young people aged 16 years, and who have be residing in a Foster Care, Kinship Care, Residential Care or a Lead Tenant placement and be subject to either a Care by Secretary Order, a Long-Term Care Order or a Family Reunification.

Referral process

All referrals to Better Futures will come via the Department of Health & Human Services Southern Region.
